Rising 1st Grade

For students entering first grade, we encourage reading at least 20 minutes per day on four out of seven days. Reading chapter books to your child increases vocabulary skills. Please note that the following books are only suggestions. Please feel free to add any books that are appropriate for you reader.

"Research has shown that the single greatest factor in predicting reading success is whether a child is read to when young." Here are some titles for your summer reading.

Please note that the reading level of the books suggested varies. If your child is already reading, have him or her read a page of the book aloud to you to see if it is a good fit. If they struggle with more than a 4-5 words on the page, it is probably too difficult, but would still be a great book to read aloud to your child.
